Shenandoah County Students Appointed State FCCLA Officers

Shenandoah County Public Schools is proud to announce that Paige Hiserman from Strasburg High School (Strasburg, Virginia) and Cheyenne Estep from Central High School (Woodstock, VA) have been appointed state FCCLA officers for the 2020-2021 school year. Paige will serve as Vice-President of Parliamentary Procedures, and Cheyenne will serve as Vice-President of Public Relations.

Paige, who is the daughter of Heather and Matthew Hiserman, has been a member of the FCCLA since she was a Grade 6 student at Signal Knob Middle School (Strasburg, Virginia). As a Grade 6 and Grade 7 student, Paige competed in STAR Events at the state level and advanced to the national competition where, in 2018, she earned a silver medal and first place in Career Investigations -- Art Teacher. Then, in 2019, Paige earned a gold medal and first place at the national level in Teach & Train. At the state 2019 FCCLA Fall Leadership Conference, Paige finished in first place in the Knowledge Bowl.

She won gold medals both years, placed in the state competition and advanced to nationals. In the 2019



FCCLA VA State Leadership Conference she won First, Silver and Trophy in Advocacy and advanced to nationals where she earned a gold medal. She was also awarded the Spirit of FCCLA Award at the State Conference.
